After school programs help support student learning and development. Students receive help meeting state and local standards in core academic subjects, such as reading and math. These programs also provide a safe environment during non-school hours.

- More than 14 million school-age children take care of themselves after the school days ends (Afterschool Alliance)
- Most juvenile crime are committed during the after school hours between 3 PM and 6PM, the least supervised hours for youth
- The parents of more than 28 million school-age children work outside the home (US Dept of Labor)

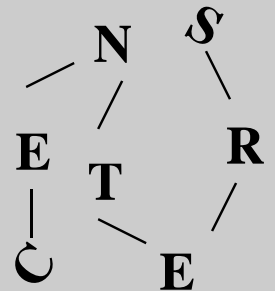
